

Sustainable Community Strategies (SCS):

SB 375 (Steinberg) effective January 1, 2009 prompts the creation of regional plans to reduce vehicle emissions and associated greenhouse gases statewide through integrated land use and transportation planning. Hermosa Beach is providing input to the "Sustainable Community Strategy" being prepared by the South Bay Cities Council of Governments. The California's Air Resources Board (CARB) is tasked with overseeing this
