Thank you the impromptu call to discuss the traffic memo. As previously indicated a traffic study with updated traffic counts would be the best way to move forward with the traffic analysis. However, to move forward with the data from the prior project that was provided then the following adjustments need to be made to the analysis:

- The growth assumption should be adjusted by a growth rate of 7 percent growth rate to bring the data to 2021.
- From 2021 onward a growth factor should be applied annually. The accompanying narrative should explain why the annual growth rate selected is appropriate.
- Additionally, please provide the analysis for the street segments identified in Carrie's email attached.

With regards to the loading spaces, it appears that approximately 9 percent of the time someone may be waiting on 2nd Street. Please add a discussion to explain if this would have any impact on emergency services and if not why. Additionally, consider adding a loading space on-site (if feasible- it cannot be a required parking space) or off-site (if you can obtain a property owner agreement).
