



Thank you for voting to lift the ban on cannabis delivery into Hermosa. Please give staff direction to finalize the adoption of this ordinance.

This is a good policy decision, as delivery is happening today illegally and has not shown to be a detriment. Now cannabis delivered can be taxed, suppliers can be properly licensed, and if there is a crime committed during the delivery process, it is more likely the crime would be reported to police.

This is also a good strategy decision given Measure M. The timing to lift the ban BEFORE the Measure M vote has shown to be correct, since the Chacker argument in favor of Measure M highlights that delivery for both medical and recreational cannabis is illegal in Hermosa. This ordinance takes away that talking point. Separating retail from delivery will appeal to the majority of voters.

Now we can unite on voting down Elliot Lewis's Catalyst Cannabis's Measure M. Interestingly, for someone so vocal on social media, he's oddly missing from his own ballot arguments.

I hope all 5 council members support this adoption.
